Principal Message November 2023

Dear Parents and Guardians:

It was great to see all parents who were able to participate in the parent teacher conferences. Parents are encouraged to contact teachers throughout the school year if you have questions, concerns or would like to discuss ways to support your child's learning and personal growth.

Term one report cards are the next opportunity for teachers to communicate student progress. These can be accessed by parents through the Parent Portal of Powerschool beginning on November 30. Report cards document student achievement of learning outcomes which are what students are required to know, understand, and be able to do by the end of a grade. In some cases, these outcomes are completed during one term; however, many outcomes will take the entire year to be achieved by the student. Students will have multiple opportunities to achieve learning outcomes and these will be reported at the end of each term.

Teachers may set "targets" as goals for students for term one and term two to assess the continuum of progress to meet a learning outcome. For example, reading levels will be expected to grow throughout the entire year and teachers will decide what is the expected level by the end of November and will report your child's progress in relation to that targeted level. In math, the expectations for computation will be higher by the end of the year than by the end of Term one.

At the elementary level, teacher comments are the most important part of the report card as they will provide clarity on whether or not the child is progressing as expected as well as provide suggestions for parents on how they can support their child's learning at home. Teachers use a variety of assessment tools to determine student progress including checklists, quizzes, projects, samples of student work and oral assessments.

All report cards in Wild Rose School Division have the same outcomes and indicators and most students will Meet (M) all learning outcomes by the end of the year. You can find more details at WRSD Administrative Procedure 360 Assessment and Reporting of Student Achievement.








CSPAC regular meeting Oct. 18th 2023

Call to order - 7:29 pm

Approval of Previous minutes - Sept. 14th Meeting minutes, Allison Approves and Dawn Seconds All in Favor

Treasure Report - General - 20,817.08 Casino -11,893.50 Bingo - 1.81 Share - \$5.72

Current - We have given a cheque to the school for (\$12 343) It is intended to be a donation for 2022/2023 swimming lessons. The school can defer the donation to the 2024 year if needed and use it for swimming lessons in the future.

We have already allotted a field trip fund of \$50/student for 23/24 year. Total - \$12,500. We have also motioned to pay for a classroom cubby for the gr. 6 classroom-Total -\$1900. Casino account will have Camp Evergreen expense of \$3000 deducted from the current total.

If all expenses come from the general account this would leave us with \$6417.08. This total does not factor in any planned fundraising for the 23/24 year. Or that spending for field trip bussing will come from the AGLC account.

Discussion on Roll over amount / Need for detailed budgeting - see below

Casino Report - Funds to be used by Sept.2024 and we must keep \$3000 in the casino account.

An amount was discussed for rollover but the majority decided it was not needed. The field trips will always happen regardless of our funding; it will just end up costing the parents more in the future. We could always have the future grades have concession or freezie days or whatever to help earmark some funds for their upcoming trip such as Camp Evergreen. Allison motioned that we have a discussion about further fundraising options when the accounts reach less than \$5000. Dawn seconds. All in favor. As stated previously, new fundraising options can always be discussed at any meeting.

Previous Business -

 Nuans report was completed. Cost 59.25. Paperwork has been sent for name change with AGLC. Approved name is Charlotte Small Parent Advisory Council. Could take months to get back. Once it does get back we can make our name change with Alberta Registries and the Bank.

New Business -

- Wilson Ball Court Proposal for wilson ball pit has been put forward by Evan Whitecotton. Cost of \$1391.21
 for 2 pits. HIs plan is to include the grade 6 class in the building of said pits. Shelby motions Nancy Seconds
 All in favor. We will try to use the casino funds but if we are not available we will use the general account.
- Classroom Funding 12 Classrooms Tabled to November.
- Penny Carnival silent auction -Janneke would like to train someone to take over the role of the silent auction.
 We also need people to sign up to gather donations. Nancy said she would help Janneke do that. We will add the office ladies to the group spreadsheet. Last year we had 105 donations. Discuss with Staff about location for auction items.
- Penny Carnival 50/50 Kayleigh motions for parent council to run a 50/50 as well as silent auction. Brittany seconds. All in favor.
- 5. Should we sell apparel at Penny Carnival?- Shelby will discuss logistics with Michelle.
- Change bank accounts from Connect First Credit Union to Rocky Credit Union Dawn Motions to close the
 accounts at The Connect First Credit Union in Eckville. Kayleigh Seconds All in favor. Janneke motions to
 change to the Rocky Mountain House Credit Union and Miranda Seconds. All in favor.
