Principal Message November 2024

As we work together to enhance our student's success, many parents reach out with questions about how to effectively support their children's learning. This month, I want to emphasize a few key areas that can significantly impact your child's educational experience.

First of all, nutrition matters! A well-balanced diet is crucial for fueling the brain and body, helping students stay focused, energetic and ready to learn. Consider limiting the amount of sugary, processed foods your child eats at school; send a variety of proteins, vegetables, fruits and whole grains if possible.

In addition, the importance of sleep cannot be overstated. Sleep is essential for brain development and cognitive functioning. A well-rested child is better equipped to focus, learn and retain information. A proper sleep schedule can also support your child in regulating emotions, resulting in more positive interactions with others at home and at school. Setting a regular bedtime routine so a child can get 9-11 hours of sleep each night, limiting screen time and creating a sleep-friendly environment can help in setting students up for a good night's sleep.

Lastly, it is important to communicate to your child that school is a priority. Regular attendance ensures they don't miss out on key learning opportunities, they develop good friendships and learn about the importance of work ethic and responsiblities. Talk to your child about what they are learning at school and express interest in their aspirations for the future.

Thank you for your support in fostering healthy habits at home. We truly appreciate our parent community at Charlotte Small, and together we can achieve our vision that all our children "Dream, Believe and Achieve."


BAKING


