




Please speak with your child about not sharing their food with other children. We will continue to ask our students to eat their lunches in their classrooms and to not take food outside.



Dear Families:

Did you know that every day a student misses school can add up to significant learning time lost? Research from Chinook's Edge School Division shows that when a child misses just two days each month, they will have missed an entire year of school by the time they reach grade 9. Missing school regularly, even in small amounts, can really impact a child's education, as each lesson builds on the one before it. Without regular attendance, it becomes much harder for students to catch up, leading to gaps in learning that can grow over time.

If a child misses four days each month, that adds up to two full years of schooling missed by the time they reach high school. This can have serious long-term effects on academic performance, social development, and even future opportunities. Attending school regularly gives students a sense of routine, structure, and belonging, which are all important for emotional and social growth. School is not just about academics—it's also a place where children develop vital life skills like teamwork, problem-solving, and communication.

SWIMMING LESSONS


Students have the opportunity to take Swimming



BRRRR......It's cold outside.....

When are buses cancelled due to Inclement Weather?

In Wild Rose School Division, <u>Administrative Procedure 133</u> guides decisions for bus cancellation, due to inclement weather. The Division takes precautions with respect to the welfare of students coming to or going from school. When road or weather conditions jeopardize the safety of students, bus routes will be cancelled.

How is the decision made to cancel buses?



- Extreme wind chill of -40 degrees or lower reported by the Weather Network for the area in question
- Visibility of less than 300 meters
- Road closure by RCMP, municipal or other local road officials

When is the decision made to cancel buses?

The Director of Transportation and Superintendent make the decision after appropriate information is gathered from each of the school areas.

This decision will typically be made prior to 6:00 am but may be made earlier if clear and compelling information is available from the Weather Network.

Communicating to families & staff



- Communications to parents/guardians and staff are sent out **via email, text or phone call** when the decision is made to cancel buses.
- Notices will also be posted on the Division website, on radio stations and on Wild Rose School Division's Facebook Page.
- Please ensure you have downloaded the free **Bus Status 4** app from Google Play or iTunes Store.
- When buses do not run, and parents/guardians choose to deliver the child to school, the parent shall also be responsible for ensuring safe transportation home for the student.

Why do WRSD Schools Remain Open during Inclement Weather Days?

When buses do not operate for the day, parents should only transport their students to school if they feel it is safe to do so. WRSD's first and most important priority is the safety of students and staff. Our second priority is to ensure learning opportunities continue as often as possible. Our third priority is to keep our schools open even when buses are not running acknowledging that our schools are important partners with parents and the community.
